A New Addition to HCA!

The Housing Corporation of Arlington is thrilled to announce a new addition this summer—our fifteenth two-family house! This two-unit acquisition was made possible by a generous commitment of CDBG funds from the Town of Arlington, HOME Investment Partnership Program funds from the North Suburban Consortium, a regional affordable housing lender, a construction loan from Cambridge Savings Bank and a firstmortgage loan from Winchester Savings Bank. With this purchase, HCA continues to help grow Arlington's stock of affordable family housing.

"Winchester Savings Bank is very excited about partnering with Housing Corporation of Arlington on this project," states Peter Segerstrom, Winchester Savings Bank President, "Winchester Savings Bank has long been a supporter of HCA's mission and hopes to be involved with HCA in many future affordable housing projects."

Located on Rawson Road, these sunny two- and three-bedroom units provide ideal living for families: a residential neighborhood, dining rooms for family meals and a backyard for play space.

In 2001, the Housing Corporation stepped up and purchased our first two-family house. By 2005, HCA owned 28 units, all in two-family homes. With a recent purchase of 18 one-bedroom apartments in 4 buildings and the additional two-family acquisition

on Rawson Road, HCA now owns 48 units of affordable rental housing. These units are scattered throughout the Town of Arlington—from the Heights to Arlington Center to East Arlington.

Both new units at Rawson will be available for low-income families with incomes below 60% of the area median income. (\$46,320 for a three-person household) Our income guidelines are adjusted annually by the federal government to assure that HCA is reaching out to low- and moderate-income families in our area.

For a fourth time in four years, HCA is teaming up with Feinmann, Inc. to rehab the Rawson apartments. Feinmann is providing construction and project management services for the effort—donating a portion of their time and profit to the project. Improvements include updating kitchens and bathrooms, renovating porches, refinishing floors, re-painting the interior and installing a new water service to the property.


HCA Going Green

As part of HCA's five-year strategic plan, the Housing Corporation made a pledge to transform the way we do business. We are committed to utilizing more sustainable construction practices and to make our general work habits more environmentally-conscious. "Our goal is to make our methods and products 'greener' and more energy efficient on every HCA project. Financial constraints are always a barrier, but the environment is a priority for HCA, not an after-thought," states David Levy, HCA's Executive Director.

At HCA's new acquisition on Rawson Road, we are employing a number of energy-saving improvements. Low-flow aerators will be installed in the kitchen and bathroom faucets. Bathrooms will also have low-flow toilets and energy saving (Continued on page 3)

HCA Ventures to Boston for MACDC Lobby Day 2008

On March 27th, a delegation from HCA took the Red Line into Boston to participate in Massachusetts Community Development Corporation (MACDC) Lobby Day 2008. At the State House, we united with affordable housing and community development leaders from across the Commonwealth to lobby for support and funding for an array of programs, including initiatives to create affordable housing. The HCA group met with Rep. Sean Garballey, Rep. Jay Kaufman, Rep. William Brownsburger and aides of Sen. James Marzilli. We spoke to them about HCA's programs and highlighted affordable housing concerns in the Arlington community. Keynote speakers, Governor Patrick and Senator Susan Tucker, Chair of the Joint Committee on Housing, greeted members of over 200 community development organizations gathered in the State House's Great Hall and spoke of the importance of CDC work in Massachusetts, especially the production of affordable housing.

Granite City Electric of Quincy is generously donating new light fixtures for both units, further helping to reduce the cost of improvements.

Feinmann first collaborated with HCA in 2004 by renovating kitchens and bathrooms within a recently-acquired twofamily home. In 2006, Feinmann also partnered with HCA by renovating the 18 one-bedroom apartments as part of our Mass Ave Preservation Project. Planned improvements will be completed by the end of August for a September 15th move-in date.

With the conclusion of this project, HCA will possess a portfolio of 18 one-bedroom units, 19 two-bedroom units, 8 threebedroom units and 3 four-bedroom units. As always, HCA continues to be on the lookout for opportunities to develop properties into affordable apartments.

shower heads. Throughout the units, we will utilize Energy Star appliances and lighting fixtures with compact fluorescent light bulbs. Finally, the entire envelope of the building will be insulated.

A number of green products will also be utilized at Rawson Rd. Composite decking made from recycled wood and plastics will be used to rebuild the four porches, and kitchen cabinets made from Lyptus, an eco-friendly hardwood farmed in Brazil, will help bring the kitchens up-to-date.
